



Roger Nord is a national of the Netherlands. Currently Deputy Director of the IMF's Institute for Capacity Development, he oversees the IMF's global partnerships. Previously, he was Deputy Director of the IMF's African Department, responsible for country operations in East Africa and francophone West Africa and oversight over the IMF's network of resident representatives in sub-Saharan Africa. He also led the

work on public finance issues in Africa and was responsible for the IMF's relations with China regarding Africa. Among his publications, he co-authored *A Rebalancing Act for China and Africa: The Effects of China's Rebalancing on Sub-Saharan Africa's Trade and Growth* (2017) with Wenjie Chen, and was the lead author of *Tanzania – The Story of an African Transition* (2009). Before joining the African Department, he was advisor to IMF Managing Director Horst Köhler and the IMF's regional representative in Central Europe. He is a graduate of the University of St. Gallen, Switzerland, and of the University of Chicago.
